From The Deputy Principal

As the 2023-2024 academic year drew to a close, our school community intensified its efforts to complete the curriculum and prepared for the end-of-year examinations for both the International and Vietnamese programs. In addition to academic pursuits, our extracurricular activities continued to be implemented as planned, providing students with opportunities to engage in a variety of experiences that fostered their personal growth and development.

Recently, our students at SIS Ha Long had the opportunity to participate in a picnic at Bach Dang National Monument on March 25, 2024. This event not only allowed them to learn about the historical significance of the Bach Dang Stake Yard, Tran Hung Dao Temple, and Bach Dang River's ancient wharf but also engaged them in interactive games that tested their knowledge and understanding of these cultural and historical landmarks. Our teachers believed that such experiential learning not only enhanced students' mastery of historical knowledge but also instilled in them a sense of responsibility and awareness for preserving and promoting cultural and historical values left by their ancestors.

Furthermore, our students achieved impressive results in the IOE exams at both the district and provincial levels. Specifically, they secured 27 district-level prizes, including 6 first prizes, 9 second prizes, 5 third prizes, and 7 KIK prizes, as well as 22 provincial-level prizes, comprising 5 first prizes, 7 second prizes, 2 third prizes, and 8 KK prizes. Our teachers congratulated and praised the students for their efforts and encouraged them to continue their hard work in preparation for the National Exam scheduled for April 5, 2024.

Additionally, from April 25 to April 28, 2024, our TIMO International Math Team, consisting of 7 students from our school, participated in the International finals in Thailand. We were confident that with the support of parents, careful preparation, and enthusiastic companionship, our students brought honor to the school and pride to their parents.

Term 4 will be a challenging period for both teachers and students, as they must complete the program, review for the second semester exam, and prepare for the Concert at the end of the school year. 


